- Nendrum - The monastic settlement at Nendrum on Mahee Island in Strangford Lough was believed to have been established by St Mochaoi (better known as Coalán) in the 5th Century AD, with links to St Patrick. It is one of the best-preserved monastic cashel structures in Ireland.
- Inch Abbey, where the story of St Patrick and the snakes was recorded
- Historic Downpatrick to uncover St Patrick’s legacy and see the High Cross in Down County Museum
- Down Cathedral and the traditional site of St Patrick’s Grave
